IN THE FLESH the Aego T isn't the boldest looking system, more of a blend into the background kind of set-up, and the angled satellites suggest an almost bashful character. Build quality is good and if you don't like the gloss black of our review Aego system, then shiny white is optional.

A neutral tonal balance

Sonically, we're delighted to report, the Aego T delivers a thoroughly enjoyable neutral tonal balance, and – helped by identical bass drivers and tweeters throughout – the system integrates extremely well. This admirable integration also, of course, relies on a cooperative subwoofer and the new twin-driver, 200w, T-System bass box is



sufficiently fast and punchy to keep up with its satellite buddies.

Play high-octane Hollywood fare and the package sounds bigger than it looks, whipping the sound swiftly around your room. Detail levels and dynamics also get a thumbs-up. With the option to buy a further pair of sats and go all-out 7.1, you've got a very tasty package.

VERDICT

Some may prefer more eye-catching looks, but the Aego T now ticks all the boxes
